I received the following note February, 2015 from Terry Sharp, National Directeur of Box car. Our Box Car efforts to-date are still well short of our sales at this time last year. Total Sales to-date are \$ 15,035 with a Quota of 38.5% and a 26.7% of Goal. Last year we were at \$18,822 and 71% of Quota.

- Some Notable Info Taken from the February Reports:

 1) There are still <u>5</u> Grands with consignments out, but no sales reported to-
 - 2) There are 8 Grands with zero consignment numbers, 3 of which had
 - consignment sales last year. France, New Hampshire, Arkansas
 - Only <u>2</u> Sous Directeurs currently maintain an <u>Area per-capita of \$1 +</u>. There were <u>2 Areas</u> with zero sales for February.

National Veterans Organization Celebrates 95th Birthday

La Societe des Quarante Hommes et Huit Chevaux, translated as "the Society of Forty Men and Eight Horses "and commonly known as the 40&8 celebrates 95 years of service to Veterans, spouses and their communities this year.

La Societe des Quarante Hommes et Huit Chevaux is an organization of select male and female U. S. veterans, more commonly known as the Forty & Eight.

The Forty & Eight is committed to charitable and patriotic aims. Our purpose is to uphold and defend the United States Constitution, to promote the well being of veterans and their widows and orphans, and to actively participate in selected charitable endeavors, which include programs that promote child welfare and nurse's training.

The titles and symbols of the Forty & Eight reflect its First World War origins. Americans were transported to the battle front on French trains within boxcars stenciled with a "40/8", denoting its capacity to hold either forty men or eight horses. This uncomfortable mode of transportation was familiar to all who fought in the trenches; a common small misery among American soldiers who thereafter found "40/8" a lighthearted symbol of the deeper service, sacrifice and unspoken horrors of war that bind all who have borne the battle.

In March of 1920, Joseph W. Breen, a member of the newly formed American Legion and an officer of Breen-McCracken Legion Post 297, met in Philadelphia with fifteen other prominent Legionnaires where they originated the idea of The Forty & Eight. They envisioned a new and different level of elite membership and camaraderie for leaders of the American Legion. The box car of the French Railways, so familiar to American ground troops of the First World War, was chosen as the symbolic heart of the new organization. The French/Railroad theme was applied to officer titles and organizational functions.

Originally an arm of The American Legion, the Forty & Eight became an independent and separately incorporated veteran's organization in 1960. Membership is a select group of honorably discharged veterans and honorably serving members of the United States Armed Forces.

The Forty et Eight's national commander, Chef de Chemin de Fer Mike Wood, recently announced that a "birthday ritual" will be celebrated during the month of March each year by local and state units of the Forty et Eight.
