

I have been disturbed by some things that I put aside. I have attempted to justify this by telling myself that it was a generational thing and that has existed since long before I was born. Here lately I have heard and seen an escalation in the behavior and I believe silence is a disservice to my fellow Voyageurs.

All of us have served in the Armed Forces.
