

Keynote Speaker Dr. Mitchell Yockelson

Mitch is a professor of military history at Norwich University and the author of four books: Forty-Seven Days: How Pershing's Warriors Came of Age to Defeat the German Army in World War I; Borrowed Soldiers: Americans under British Command, 1918; MacArthur: America's General; and Grant: Savior of the Union. He is the chief historical advisor to the U.S. World War One Centennial Commission.

His talk: Woodrow Wilson and John Pershing: Why America Entered World War I and How Its Forces Helped Lead the Allies To Victory.

"After standing on the sidelines for three years, on April 6, 1917, President Woodrow Wilson brought the United States into World War I. After a lengthy mobilization to build up and train the Army, General John J. "Black Jack" Pershing led the American Forces on the Western Front where the doughboys proved themselves at the pitched, grinding battles of Cantigny, Belleau Wood, Chateau Thierry, St. Mihiel, and the forty--seven day long Meuse--Argonne battle. Dr. Mitch Yockelson will explain how America helped our Allied partners defeat the German Army in 1918."
