Join The Historic Trust and the Community Military Appreciation Committee in a Veterans Day Ceremony on November 11, 2021 at a.m. at the Artillery Barracks at 605 Hatheway Rd., Vancouver, WA 98661.

The free public observance will include words of tribute by special guest speakers, musical performances by local schools, and military displays. This year's keynote speakers are 3rd Congressional District Congresswoman Jaime Herrera Beutler, Vancouver Mayor Anne McEnerny-Ogle, Vancouver Police Department Assistant Chief Troy Price, and 1st Sergeant Michael Robertson, U.S. Army, retired.
