The Annual Influenza Immunization Campaign at the VA Portland Health Care System is on!

Please help us share the word about how Veterans can get their flu shot now!

Here is a link to <u>information on WHY YOU</u> <u>should get a flu shot</u>.

You can get your flu shot at your local clinic now. Your VA clinic offers walk-in flu shots during all open hours.

Between Monday, September 11, 2017 and Wednesday, November 22, 2016, you can stop by the Atrium of the main PVAMC hospital to get your shot. The walk-in clinic is open from 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday through Thursday, except holidays.

You also can get your flu shot at a local <u>Walgreens Pharmacy</u> at no cost to you between now and March 31, 2018. Show your Veteran identification card and another photo ID to get the shot.

You do not need an appointment to get a flu shot at a walk-in flu clinic or a Walgreens Pharmacy. Veterans with scheduled medical appointments at any VA facility can ask for a flu shot at that time.

At VA and at Walgreens, you will be offered a regular dose of the flu shot. You may have heard that Veterans aged 65 and older can receive a different vaccine. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has advised that the regular dose is effective with all persons aged 6 months and older.

If you get your flu shot outside of VA or Walgreens, please leave us a voice mail message to let us know at (503) 273-5225.

Veterans Day Ceremony is going to move from the Reserve Center to the Providence Academy across from the downtown Library. It will start at 10:00 am, before the parade.

- 3. Visit the VA clinic in the community where you get your care.

4. Visit your local Walgreens Pharmacy.
