There is nothing wrong with that when it's done with respect for the opinions of others. Where it becomes a problem is when the criticism becomes personal, oftentimes hateful and disrespectful. The 40/8 was designed as a FUN organization. A place to go to relax and enjoy yourself. Our National Constitution and our own clearly state that we are a NON-POLITICAL Group. That doesn't mean that you're not allowed to affiliate with any particular political group, of course you can. What is not expected or desired are comments which intimidate someone else because of their beliefs. Tribalism plays a very large part in this problem today. Some people think that either you're with me in what I believe 100% or if not, you're against me 100%. There is no middle ground in their minds eye for conversation or intelligent discussion. I feel that freedom of speech and expression are needed to help keep us, as an organization and as a nation, on course, but not at the expense of intimidating or humiliating another member of this Voiture.
