Naturally Carl Lingenfelter is an honored WWll veteran who served in the US Navy. His last ship was the Vicksburg. His Cruiser was directed to accompany the Battleship USS Missouri into Tokyo Bay to witness the surrender of the Japanese Forces in 1945.

Carl grew up on a fruit farm in the Castle Rock area. His family always had plenty to eat, but no money. They did everything by hand and just eeked out a living. Carl joined the Navy in April of 1942 and served on three ships before the Vicksburg. That's where the action began. Carl witnessed the raising



of the flag on Iwo Jima, as well as the taking of Okinowa, the bloodiest battle in the Pacific. (When I was in Okinowa in the 1960's, it was a peaceful island nation with seven little towns along the main road. I saw nothing to remind me of the WWll battle.) Carl "had enough service points to leave the Navy following the war. He could have re-

enlisted but decided to return home with the rank of

gunner's mate 2nd class."* Carl spent 30+ years as a cross country trucker

WHAT IS 40 ET 8?

La Société des Quarante Hommes et Huit Chevaux (The Society of Forty Men and Eight Horses)













We are a non-profit fraternal organization supporting our community and other veterans' charities. Programs include POW/MIA, Nurses Training, Youth Sports, Veterans Assistance, Americanism, and much more. Since January of 1985, our local chapter of 40 et 8, (Voiture 99) has raised and donated more than 6.5 million dollars that goes to civic groups and organizations in Clark County.

The 40 et 8 story begins with World War I American soldiers who were transported to battle in French railway box cars that were half the size of American cars. The French cars could hold either 40 men or 8 horses. Riding in them was horrible. They were often cold, drafty, dirty and rough riding. Packed in these cars, the American doughboys bonded and developed a sense of humor to laugh at their bleak conditions.

After the war, the soldiers returned home and founded the American Legion to fight for veterans' rights and benefits. They

also discovered a need to recreate the camaraderie and sense of humor that carried them through the tough times in France.

In 1920, a group of Legionnaires meeting in Philadelphia formed La Societe des 40 Hommes et 8 Chevaux (translated: the Society of 40 men and 8 horses). They called their chapters Voitures and their idea spread like wildfire to Legion posts throughout America.

Vancouver's Voiture 99 was chartered in 1922.
