





Philip Eugene Ruhmshottel
March 13, 1941 - March 18, 2020

Philip "Phil" Ruhmshottel, 79, of Vancouver, WA, passed away on Wednesday, March 18, 2020 at the Elaine and Don Heimbigner Hospice Care Center in Vancouver of congestive heart failure and a traumatic brain injury. Phil was born March 13, 1941, to Herbert and Lillian Ruhmshottel in Cornwall, NY, the middle of three children.



In 1959, Phil joined the U.S. Marine Corps where he served 5 years during the Cuban Missile Crisis and at NAS Sangley Point on Manilla Bay, Philippines just before the Vietnam War. In 1969 he moved out to the West Coast to be with his two children from a previous marriage, Diane and Alan (both now deceased). In 1983, Phil met his soon-to-be bride of 34 years when she moved across the street. He later married Caroline Smith Netzel in 1985. As a truck driver for Coca-Cola, Phil worked for the company for 25 years, eventually retiring in 1998. In his spare time, he loved to read, work with wood and garden, along with spending time with his family.

In retirement, Phil led a full and active life embracing all around him as a leader in many groups helping veterans. Phil was a charter member of the Marine Corps League Columbia River Detachment, filling many positions including Commandant of the local detachment in 2000 and Department Commandant around 2005. He was selected by his peers to be the Marine of the Year locally and at the State level. Furthering his involvement, Phil was involved with the Military Order of Devil Dogs, at all levels including National Dog Robber and 53rd National Chief Devil Dog in 2009-11. Accentuating his love of veterans, he served under Governor Gregoire on the Governor's Council for Veteran's Affairs from 2000-2008 where he advocated wherever possible for veterans as well as worked on developing the WA State Veterans License Plate program. Also, he enjoyed leading the local voyagers of the 40 et 8 as their Chef De Gare in 2008.

Well known in the veteran community, Phil greeted those who entered the VA at the Vancouver, WA campus at the information desk with a warm smile and friendly "may I help you?". He was a gentle gracious man who possessed the ability to talk to anyone and make them feel comfortable. Between 1999-2019, he directed visitors for over 20 years and over 7,500 volunteer hours.

After recovering from a broken hip in April 2019, he fell in May causing a traumatic brain injury with four brain bleeds and frontal lobe damage. Phil courageously powered through the many challenges of the injury with a steady decline in health and more rapid decline January through early March. He was in the loving care of his family at home until a hospice care facility became necessary two days before his death.



Phil is survived by his wife Caroline, his sister Valerie Hoppenstedt in New York State, his daughter Nicole Rounce, and many nieces and nephews. A graveside service and celebration of life will be scheduled and held at later dates. Phil's volunteer work at the Vancouver VA was his passion, ministry, and fellowship. A Phil Ruhmshottel Memorial Fund has been set up to help any veteran with a personal need to be handled by the VA Voluntary Services.
