MY STORY

Clifton (Cliff) Arnold Taylor Jr.

I was wrecked in 2010. Lyle Wood introduced and sponsored me into the 40 & 8. I have been an active member and have held the following offices: Nurse's Training Directeur, Guard de la Porte, Aumonier and the Grande Chef de Tran.

I have worked in various family businesses; I have owned some and managed some including family restaurants, T-shirt and Ball Cap Shop, Printing Company, and a Grocers and Mortgage business. I have managed a flower shop and landscaping company.

I stay active and "I could not have done this without the love and support of my wife Susanne Taylor of Cabane 99 La Femmes, Vancouver, Washington."

I have seven children and fifteen grandchildren.

In 1977 I joined the Navy. He was assigned to the USS Ponce, a troop transport out of Norfolk, Virginia. He has many floats under his belt: Artic Circle, The North Sea, The Mediterranean, Black Sea, Suez Canal, and "conflicts that still cannot be mentioned to this day." His ports of call include Spain, Finland, Germany, Capri, France, Italy, the United Kingdom, the Netherlands, Norway and Greece.

I changed from the Navy to the Army when many naval bases closed. I have served in active duty in the Reserves and the National Guard. My service included the Military Police in California and Oregon. I have also served in New Orleans, Louisiana with the Disaster Support and Rescue Hurricane Mission following Katrina and Rita in 2005.

In 2007 I was deployed to Iraq. I was a team leader of an 1151 Humm-V, and then moved to drive the command vehicle. nfortunately, I was severely wounded February 20, 2008 and spent one year at the Ft. Lewis Hospital known as JBLM after which I was medically retired.

I met Lyle Wood while working in Security at the Army Corps of Engineers.
